
# Arts & Music In Schools Proposition 28 Plan

## What Types of Arts Can Be Funded?

"Arts education program" includes (but is not limited to) instruction and training, supplies, materials, and arts educational partnership programs for instruction in dance, media arts, music, theatre, and visual arts including folk art, painting, sculpture, photography, craft arts, creative expression including graphic arts and design, computer coding, animation, music composition, ensembles, script writing, costume design, film, and video.

### LEA Size Mandate

"LEAs (district) with 500 or more pupils are required to ensure that at least 80% expenditures for an allocation year are used to employ certificated or classified personnel to provide arts education program instruction as required by EC8820(g)(1) and as defined by EC8820(a)."

#### Pooling Resources

Schools can share teachers, teacher aides, and arts partners. District can facilitate sharing of resources among schools. However, the AMS statute does not provide for the reallocation of funds.

#### Scheduling

Arts instruction can happen before, during or after the regular school day. Students should be under the immediate supervision of a certificated employee of the LEA to generate attendance for apportionment and receive instructional time credit.



## Input Gathered From Parents, Students and Staff

- 1. Fund programs that are engaging and hands-on for students. (actual science, STEAM, social studies, etc.).
- 2. Hands on projects. Let students work with their hands to build and create.
- 3. Student support. Provide teachers with time to plan and focus on student learning needs.

<ul> <li>Use of funds for cost of arts education program instruction by certificated or classified employees</li> <li>80/20 requirement</li> <li>Use of funds for administrative costs can be no more than one percent.</li> </ul>	Year 3 of expenditure period or when the allocation is fully expended, whichever comes first.
