




Our Budget

Local Control Funding Formula

California's school funding law, called the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) is a new way for schools to focus on student success.

Districts will receive a base, supplemental, and concentration grants as a result of the number of Low Income, Foster Youth, and English Language Learners in the district.

Local Control Funding Formula

Base Grant

(K-3, 4-6, 7-8, 9-12)

Supplemental

(Additional 20% Foster Youth, English Learners, Low Income students)

Concentration

(Additional 50% for 55% or more Foster Youth, English Learners, Low income students)

8-year Phase-in Process

Local Control Funding Formula

- The goal of the LCFF is to significantly simplify how state funding is provided to districts.
- The LCFF requires school districts to involve parents in planning and decision making as well as in developing the Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP).

LCAP Requirements

- Each school district must engage parents, educators, employees and the community to establish these plans.
- The plans will describe the school district's overall vision for students, annual goals and specific actions the district will take to achieve the vision and goals.
- The LCAP must address each of the State's 8 Priorities.

LCAP Development Process – 2015-16

- Two district-wide LCAP input meetings November 30 and December 16.
- Site based LCAP meetings in January/February
- LCAP drafts to Board for public hearings in April/May
- Completed LCAP by June 1

The California State Standards

California's new standards for English and mathematics remodel the state's education system.

Children will participate in hands-on learning, which help them develop the critical thinking and analytical skills they need to deal with an ever-changing world.

Mathematics

- Greater focus on fewer topics
- Coherence: Linking topics and thinking across grades
- Rigor: Pursue conceptual understanding, procedural skills and fluency, and application with equal intensity
- Focus on 8 Mathematical Practices:







Grade 5: Performance Task Overview (105 total minutes):

Title: Honus Wagner

Session 1 (35 minutes): Ultimately tasked with writing a narrative story, in this session, students will look at two photographs, view a brief video, and read one literary text and one informational text. Students will take notes on these sources. They will then respond to three research questions about the video and texts.


Session 2 (70 minutes): Finally, students will work individually to compose a full-length narrative from the point of view of Honus Wagner, referring to their notes as needed. Pre-writing, drafting, and revising will be involved.

Scorable Products: Student responses to the constructed-response questions and the narrative will be scored.
