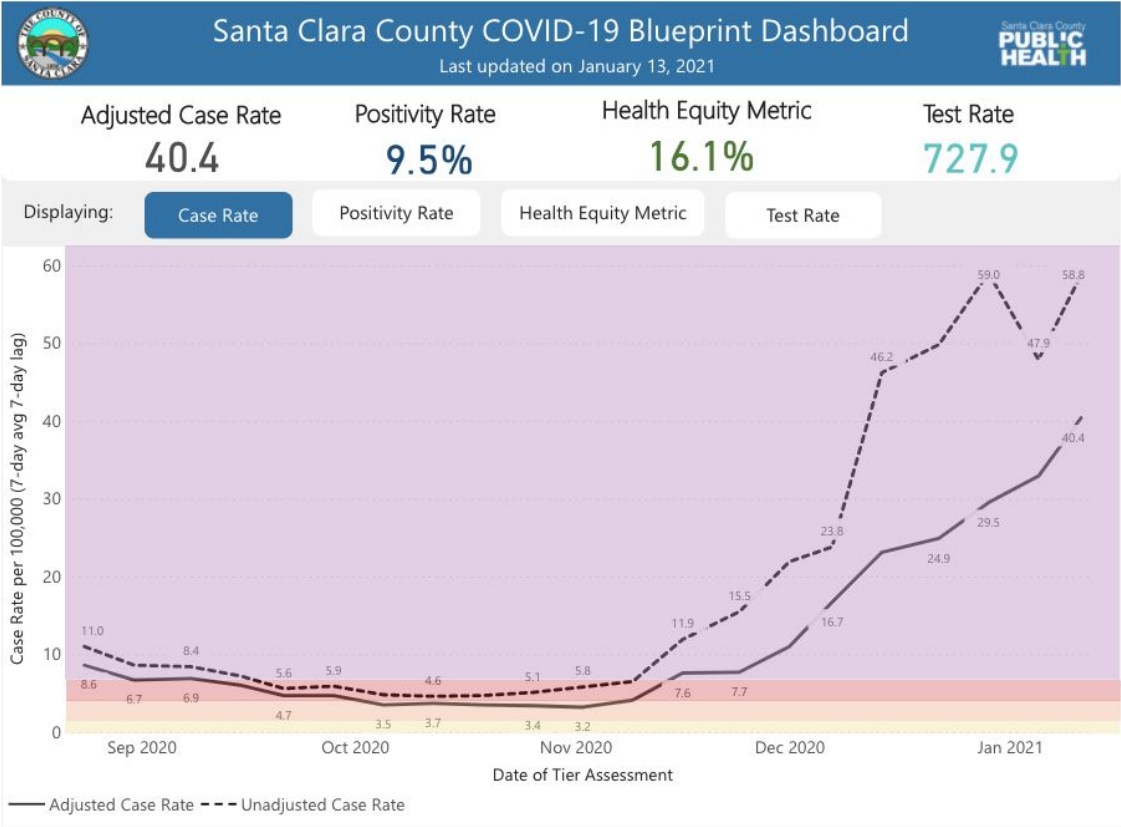
on Transition to Phase 2 for In-Person Instruction

Current Status

- The Governor announced a proposal for grant funds to support reopening schools for in-person instruction
 - We will not move to Phase 2 until we are in the Red (Substantial) Tier
 - We have started our employee COVID-19 testing
 - Educators are in Phase 1B for vaccination
 - Our programs that were open, remain open
 - Schools communicated site-level plans to families before the Winter Break (email and parent meetings)

Governor's Proposal (announced 12/30/20)

- Provide ~ \$450 per student in incentive grant to fund additional costs of implementation
 - Uses Prop 98 funds to set aside the \$2B to fund this
 - Plan must be submitted by February 1
 - There is no template for a plan. There are elements in the proposal.
 - Must be approved by legislation
 - Anticipate adjustments to the proposal

Elements of the Proposal

- ✓ The proposal acknowledges reopening cannot happen if the adjusted case counts are higher than 28 per 100,000
 - Adjusted case rate in our county was 40.4 (1/13/21)
 - ✓ Phase in - start with TK-2 and vulnerable groups
 - ✓ MOU with labor groups
 - ✓ Plan/IIPP includes all new CalOSHA requirements
 - ✓ Testing for staff
 - Testing for students
 - Investigating student testing option with *Color*

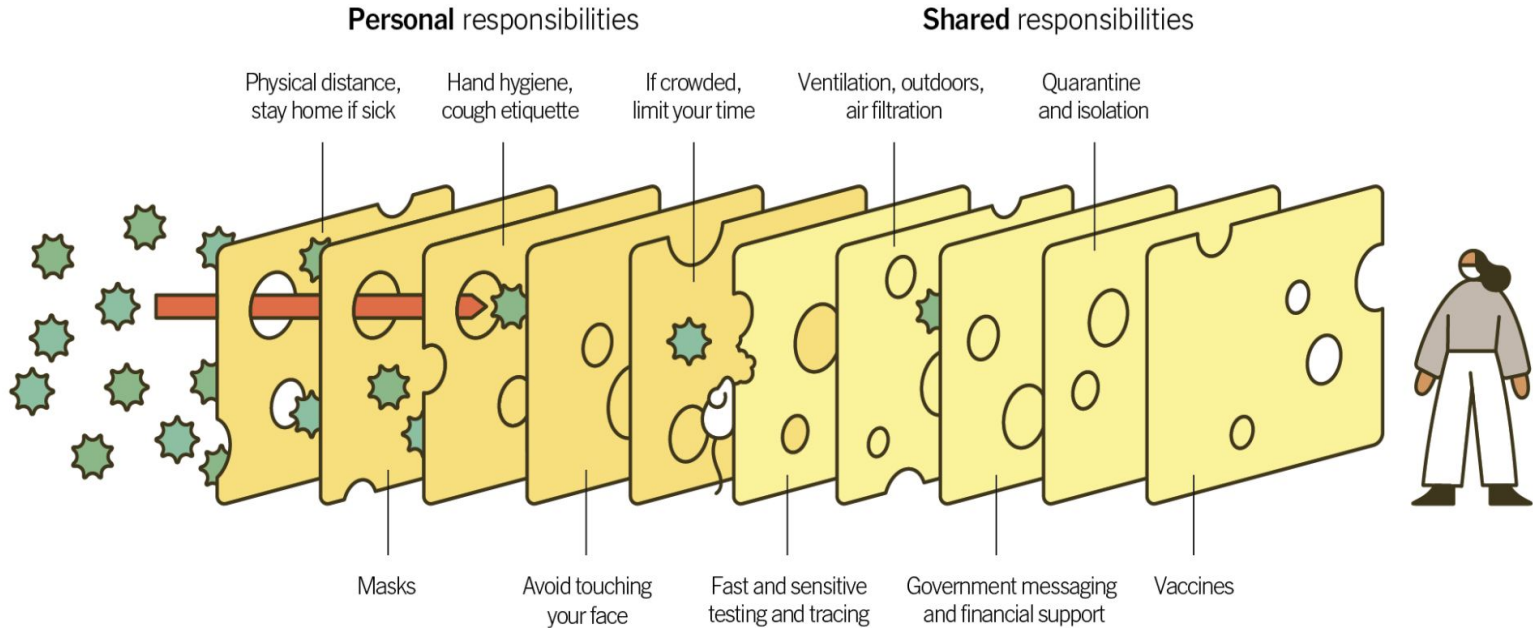
