CUSD Reopening Plan Published July 2020

The Process and Landscape

- Work groups examine all public health department requirements and recommendations, assess all operations, secure necessary supplies and PPE to ensure compliance. (Spring-Fall 2020)
- Participation on State ACSA Supts Reopening Advisory Group. (4/16/2020, 4/30, 5/8, 5/13)
 - Advisory Group's Final Report issued May 2020.
 - Requested state or regional criteria rather than by each district.
- District Reopening Committee meets. (6/24/2020, 7/8, 7/15, 9/16, 9/30, 10/13, 10/20, 2/11/2021)

 Actions: Review work group safety guidelines, survey outcomes; Brainstorm potential schedules; Seek input from site staff to share at our meetings; Review draft reopening plan; Provide recommendations
- Reopening Plan presented to Governing Board. (7/24)
- Reached Agreement (MOU) with Classified Association. (7/25)

Landscape (cont.)

- Waiver obtained (8/20) for small group instruction in Phase 1.
 - Small group cohort guidance released by SCCPHD. (8/24/20)
- Surveyed Staff & Community. (September/October 2020)
 - 56% families indicate ready.
 - 31% staff indicated ready only 23% of classroom teachers ready.
- Reached additional agreement (MOU) with Teachers Association. (12/2/20)
- Governor presents a proposed incentive plan. (12/30/20)
 - Required Legislative approval .
- New Guidelines from CDPH with new 25 per 100K metric. (1/14/21)
- Invited to present for Finance & Education Senate Hearing. (1/21/21)
- Legislators working on revised criteria. (ongoing)

Two Models Offered in August

Both options comply with SB98

Hybrid Model (Phased-in Reopening)

- Planned with the goal to return students back to campus when safe.
- Students in smaller cohorts (A/B) even while distance learning.
- Small groups of students may come back for some in person instruction as needed even during distance learning phase and following all safety guidelines.

Full Year Distance Learning

- Full school year commitment.
- Sign up by Aug. 3. (Enrollment determines staffing)
- Taught by a district teacher but not necessarily from child's home school.
- Teacher determines exact schedule.
- Students may return to their 2020-21
 assigned school the following year unless
 the next grade is not at that school.

Topic: Phase 2 and Scheduling

What we said in July mostly still applies

- We will only go to Phase 2 when safe to do so in compliance with our reopening plan of Red Tier.
- Transition to Hybrid depends on local conditions and Public Health Dept. orders.
- 2-week advance notice to families.
- Must work within staffing ratio allocation when "in-person" phase begins.
 - We will have a provision for those who chose Phase-in Model, but are not yet ready to return for in-person.
 - Schools will be sending out that information on Thursday, 2/25
- Staggered times/varied entrances to support social distancing.

Where We are Now: Current Status

- 1. Governor lifts stay at home order Jan. 26, 2021. Our county is still in Purple (Widespread) Tier.
- 2. Governor's proposed plan is going through legislative process.
- 3. Calif. Dept. of Public Health (CDPH) New Framework with consolidated guidance for in-person instruction.
- 4. CUSD updated School Reopening Plan and will begin Phase 2 on first Monday after 14 days in Red Tier.
- 5. Employee COVID-19 testing, tracking & tracing continues.
- 6. Student testing of symptomatic or close contact required.
- 7. Developing a district dashboard to show positive case counts and quarantines.
- 8. Education Staff can be vaccinated in our county effective 2/28/21.

COVID-19 Testing, Tracking & Tracing

Testing

- Staff Testing monthly since Jan. 2021.
- Investigating student testing option.
- Community Testing: Feb. 6 event at Family Learning Ctr.

Tracking & Tracing

- Daily Symptom Screener.
 - Follow up on symptomatic and/or confirmed cases.
 - Identify possible close contacts and/or exposures.
- Reporting cases
 - Santa Clara Public Health
 - COVID-19 Notifications

Positive Cases

(On site 7/1/20 - 2/1/21)

- Employees: 31 (7% of 448 emp. on site)
- Preschool: 9 (4% of 223 students)
- Learning Lab: 12 (2% of 510 students)
 - Closed 9 cohorts due to close contacts
- Outbreaks: 0

Schools Add Site Specifics to Phase 2 Hybrid Planning

District plan provides guidance for safe school operations and scheduling.

Schools apply guidance to site implementation plans.

In December 2020, each school provided families with site-specific schedules, handbooks and other detailed information for Phase 2.

The Phase 2 Hybrid Schedule

- TK-2 and Middle Grade 6 come back first.
 - *3-5 One week later at elementary
 - 7- 8 One week later at middle schools
- In-person learning up to 4 hrs; 2 days for each cohort.
- Cohorts A & B roughly half of the full class enrollment. Siblings in same cohort.
- Staggered start/end times for grades, varied entrance/exit points to limit congestion.
- Provisions for siblings to arrive together, as much as practicable.

- Assigned seating within the classroom.
- Staggered recess times to avoid mixing cohorts.

Wednesdays

- Up to 1 hour live instruction in the morning.
- 1 hour small group instruction for special populations.
- Distance learning for students for the remainder.
- Time for teacher collaboration, staff development, staff meeting, and preparation time.

* CSI 3-6; Sherman Oaks 3-5. A week later 6 & 7

Reopening Committee - Phase 2 Recommendations

- Simultaneous method (Roomers & Zoomers) not favored.
 - Tech hang ups, added distraction for teacher.
 - Want in-person experience different from remote.
- Middle schools are more comfortable with hybrid.
- Investigate ways to use special staff for async and synchronous activities.
- Examine ways to use parent volunteers (chat monitors, other).
- Determine use of Special Ed. staff, Reading intervention, etc. into the schedule.
- Iterate on Phase 2 for Phase 3 plans.
 - How to provide check in and support for asynch students when in-person time is extended
 - Provisions and schedules for lunch

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Original Plan for Phase 3 Must Adjust for Social Distancing

Phase 3: Elementary Schedule: Full Classes

Blend Cohorts A & B

- Bring together both cohorts of students (full class sizes) for in-person instruction, half day
- 5 mornings a week.
- Distance learning in the afternoon for students.



Phase 4: Elementary Schedule

All students come back to school with a traditional full day schedule.

Note: Schedules do not show dates between phases. New <u>California</u>
<u>Department of Public Health quidance</u> calls for using specific metrics to determine if school districts can start in-person instruction. Communication will go out at the beginning of each month that will provide dates for when transitions between phases will occur.

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Reopening Committee - Phase 3 Recommendations

Partial list...

- Apply what we learn from Phase 2 hybrid to planning Phase 3.
- Extend the school day (e.g. traditional schedule). We will have more things worked out, better weather.
- Use outdoor spaces as much as possible. Consider possibilities of splitting large classes, need for supervision, scheduling AM/PM, etc.

Next Steps

- Notice to families this week that includes:
 - Reminder of cohort and school schedule.
 - Provision for parent to indicate "not ready to return" (Not part of our original plan).
- Synthesize comments received today and report back to the community first week of March.
- Finalize the process to provide the "not ready" hybrid option within labor agreements and legal requirements (SB98).
- Eagerly await Red Tier and our gradual return to in-person instruction.
