Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF)

- California's school funding law, called the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) is a new way for schools to focus on student success.
- Districts will receive a base, supplemental, and concentration grants as a result of the number of Low Income, Foster Youth, and English Language Learners in the district.

Local Control Funding Formula

Base Grant

(K-3, 4-6, 7-8, 9-12)

Supplemental

(Additional 20% Foster Youth, English Learners, Low Income students)

Concentration

 (Additional 50% for 55% or more Foster Youth, English Learners, Low income students)

8 Year Phase-in Process

Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP) Requirements

- Each school district must engage parents, educators, employees and the community to establish these plans.
- The plans will describe the school district's overall vision for students, annual goals and specific actions the district will take to achieve the vision and goals.
- The LCAP must address each of the State's 8 Priorities.

LCAP Development Process • 2016-17

- District-wide LCAP input meetings TBA
- Site-based LCAP meetings in January/February
- ▶ LCAP drafts to Board for public hearings in April/May
- Completed LCAP by June 1



LCAP Goals

- ▶ **Goal 1:** All Students will receive high quality instruction in Common Core and NGSS standards from highly qualified teachers in 21st Century Classrooms.
- Goal 2: Multiple Measures will be used to assess individual student academic growth achievement for all students. Actions/services were aligned to: support of data analysis, intervention, staffing and professional development

LCAP Goals

- **Goal 3:** Student will receive sufficient and appropriate tiered supports that promote and sustain their positive social/emotional development that enable them to learn and thrive in their classrooms.
- ▶ **Goal 4**: Parent will feel encouraged and invited to participate in their child's learning experiences both at school and at home.


The California State Standards

California's new standards for English and mathematics remodel the state's education system. Children will participate in hands-on learning, which help them develop the critical thinking and analytical skills they need to deal with an ever-changing world.



Mathematic Standards

- Greater focus on fewer topics
- Coherence: Linking topics and thinking across grades
- Rigor: Pursue conceptual understanding, procedural skills and fluency, and application with equal intensity
- Focus on 8 Mathematical Practices



English Language Arts Standards

- Regular practice with complex text and their academic language
- Reading, writing, and speaking grounded in evidence from texts, both literary and informational
- Building knowledge through content-rich nonfiction






State Assessment Results: English Language Arts


